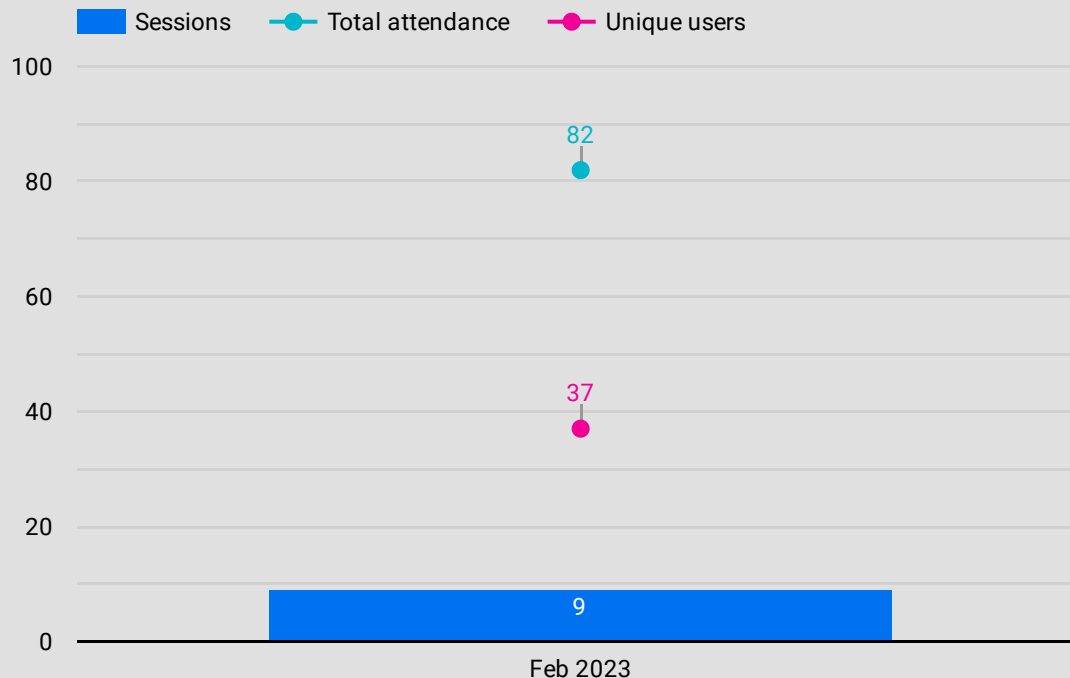

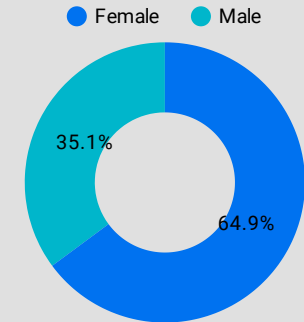

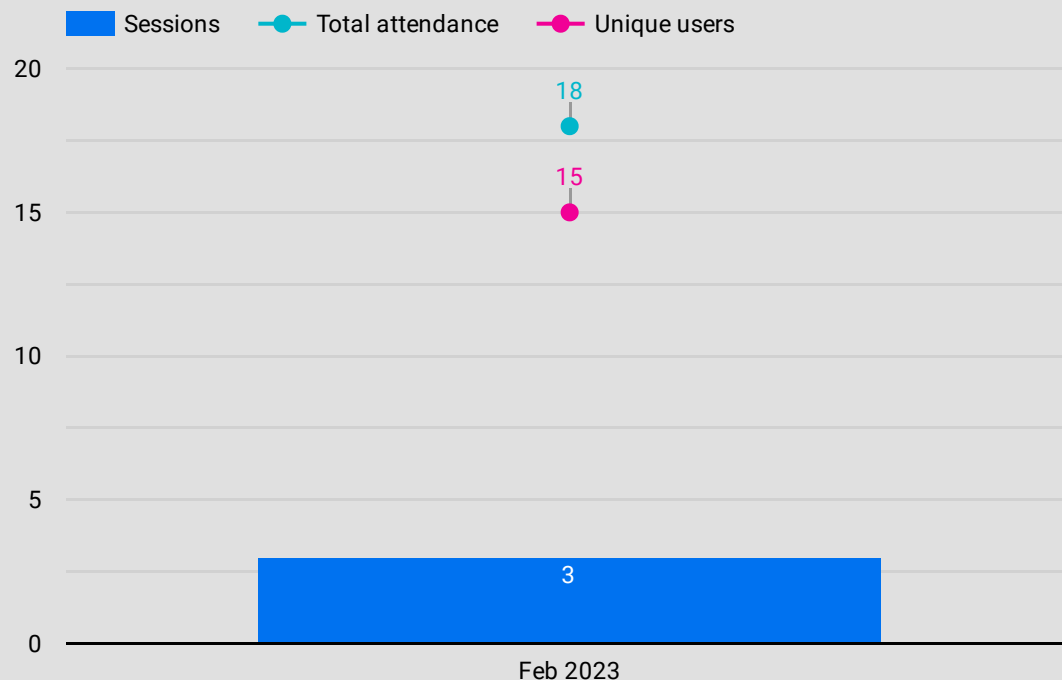
Open Skate Sessions.

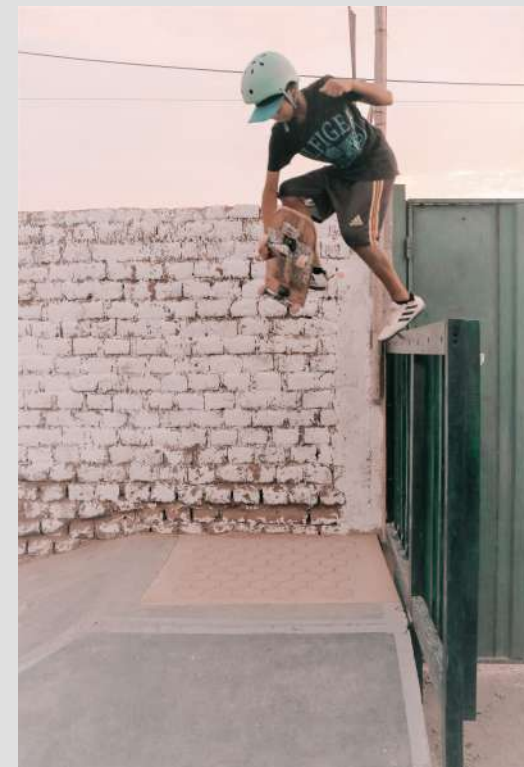
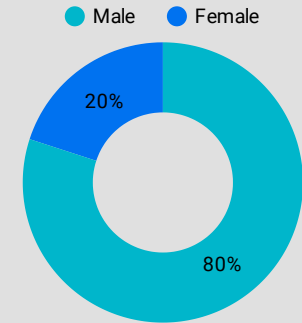

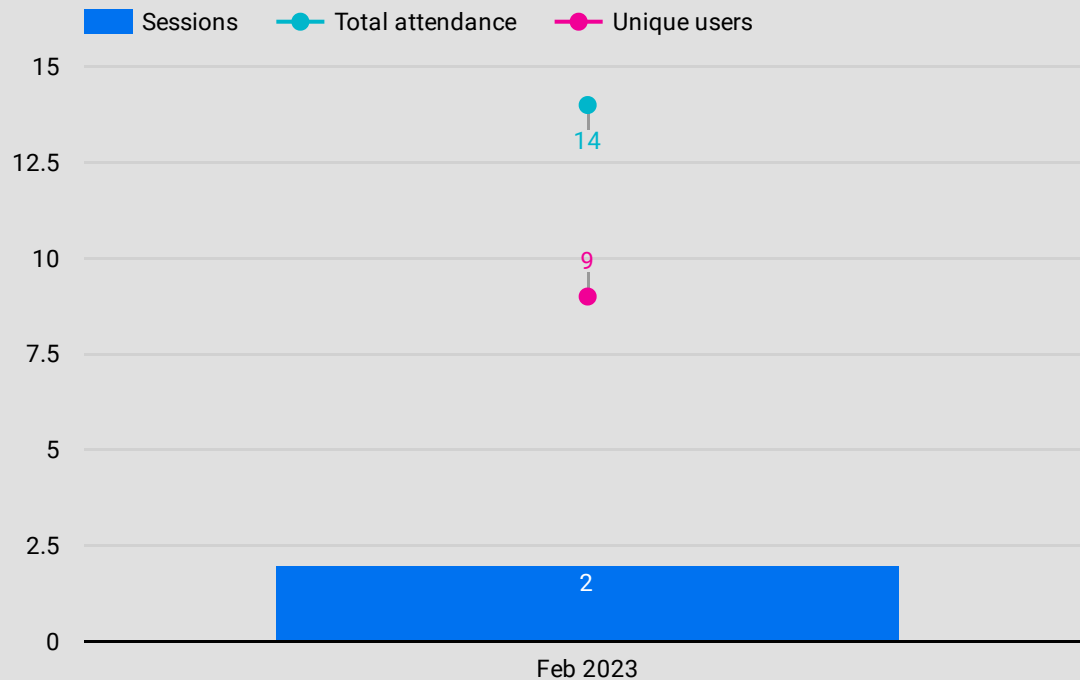


Girls Skate Sessions.

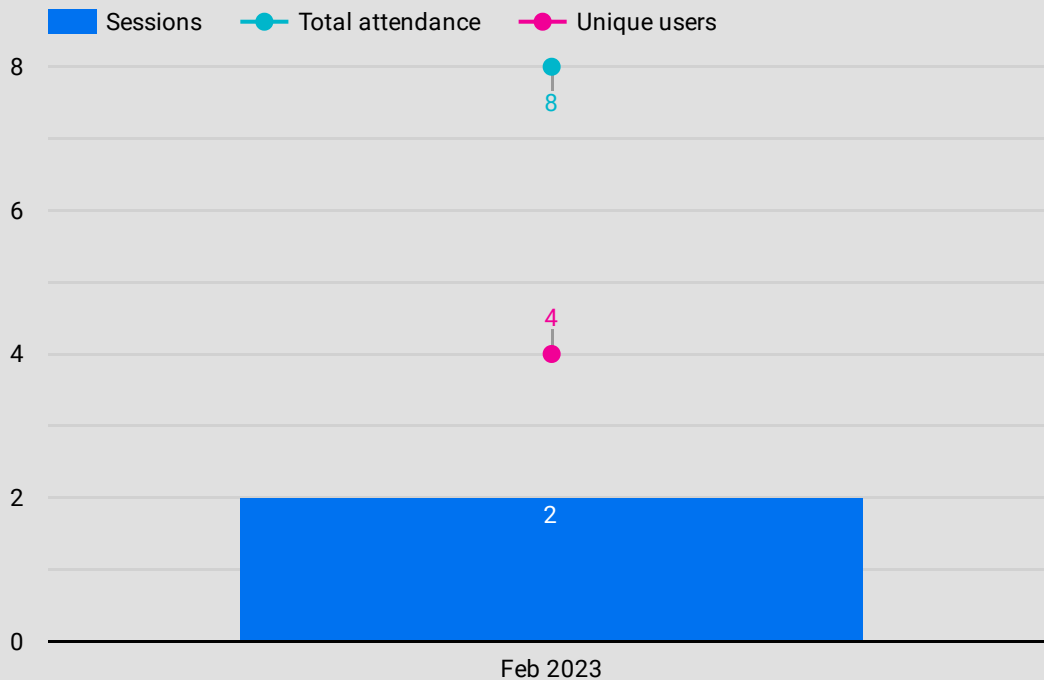


Disability Sessions.

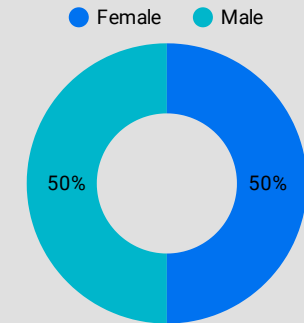

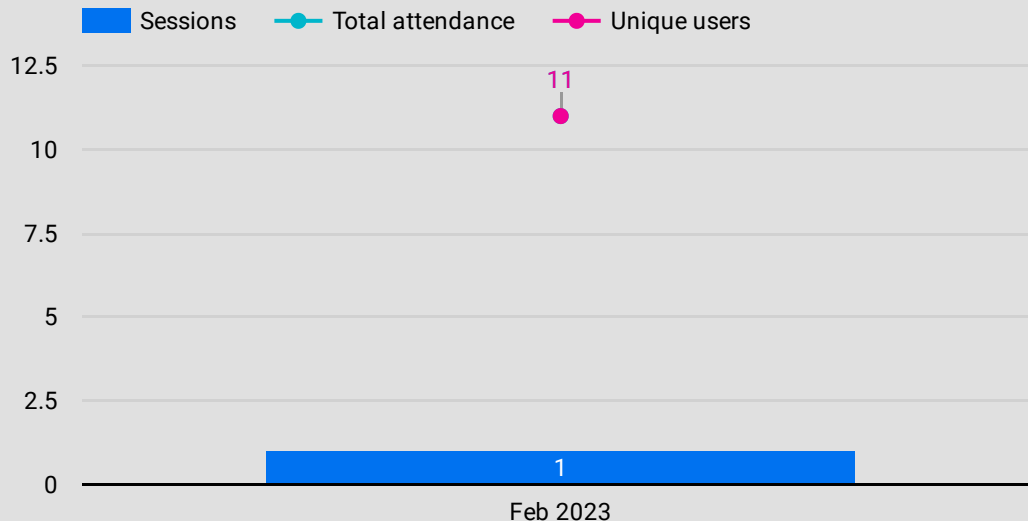

📌 Note.

The original plan entailed hosting an event at the skatepark, but due to bad weather, the event was relocated to an indoor venue at the centre (theatre). Initially, a Kendama workshop was hosted by Tim for the children. Following that, a circle was formed, and each participant was given the opportunity to introduce themselves to the others. Subsequently, skate videos were projected onto the wall using the centre's video projector, allowing the children to either watch the videos, engage in Kendama or finger-skate, or read skate magazines. A break was then taken at the centre, during which children from both the village and the centre intermingled and enjoyed pleasant moments together. A group of visitors even joined in to prepare crepes for the children from the centre, fostering a sense of shared experience. Upon returning to the theatre, a workshop was held to set up new boards that had been generously donated a few days prior. Griptape was applied to the boards, and the trucks were changed. A screening of the documentary "A Place To Skate" ensued, accompanied by cookies, candies, and sodas for everyone. Lastly, the room was cleaned collectively, and a closing discussion was held to conclude the event.
