



# Freedom Skatepark Programming

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October 13th - November 13th



## 1 / Get on Board

This is the boardloan programme the Skatepark has in place to facilitate people that would like to skate but don't have a skateboard. Anyone can access the programme for free if they help with small jobs around the skatepark or participate in Community Activities. Board and/or protection material can also be rented for \$100 JMD each. The rental money is 100% reinjected in the skatepark activities. Registration is required for this programme.

**230** Uses first month (July 18th - August 15th)

**249** Uses second month (August 15th - September 10th)

**513** Uses third month (September 11 - October 12)

**283** Uses fourth month (October 13 - November 13)

- 41% was for skate classes (free)
- 26% was in exchange for Community Support jobs
- 33% was in exchange for money

After first month: 123 registrations

- 26% female & Average age: 13

After second month: 176 people registered

- 31% female & Average age: 13

After third month: 256 people registered

- 32% female & Average age: 13

After fourth month: 280 people registered

- 31% female & Average age: 12

## 2 / Community activities

Every month a community activity is organized to strengthen the community feeling for people engaged in the skatepark, as well as a 'trade-off' for free board rental. Besides the monthly Community Activity, little jobs can be done around the skatepark throughout the month in exchange for free board rental. The participants are a mix of Edu-Skate students, parents and local skateboarders.

This is CJF's skateboard programming. Each weekday between 3pm - 4.30pm free skateboarding classes are organised with a focus on a different life-skill each week. Registration is required for this programme.

(September 11th - October 12th)

**125** youths registered  
(between 6-16 years old)

Predominantly from local  
community

39 girls (31%), 86 boys (69%)  
Average age: 11

**15** classes given

## Fourth Month

(October 13th - November 13th)

**147** youths registered  
(between 6-16 years old)

Predominantly from local  
community

43 girls (29%), 104 boys (71%)  
Average age: 9
