
# Freedom Skatepark Programming

Feburary 1st 2021 - February 28th 2021






### 1/Get on Board

This is the boardloan programme the Skatepark has in place to facilitate people that would like to skate but don't have a skateboard. Anyone can access the programme for free if they help with small jobs around the skatepark or participate in Community Activities. Board and/or protection material can also be rented for \$100 JMD each. The rental money is 100% reinjected in the skatepark activities. Registration is required for this programme.

### **323** uses this month (February 2021)

- → 20% was for skate classes (free)
- → 20% was in exchange for Community Support jobs
- → 60% was in exchange for money

## 2 / Community activities

Every month a community activity is organized to strengthen the community feeling for people engaged in the skatepark, as well as a 'trade-off' for free board rental. Besides the monthly Community Activity, little jobs can be done around the skatepark throughout the month in exchange for free board rental. The participants are a mix of Edu-Skate students, parents and local skateboarders.

### 63 Engagement in Community Activities in February 2021

#### Jobs included:

- → Build bamboo fence and protective fences
- $\rightarrow$  Paint and cement/ set up swings set
- $\rightarrow$  Clear entrance
- $\rightarrow$  Move pallets/steel
- $\rightarrow$  Move dirt, manure fruit trees, fertilize fruit trees, water plants, plant flowers
- ightarrow Mix cement and build guard house
- $\rightarrow$  Move stones for garden
- → Fill tires with dirt
- $\rightarrow$  Pickup trash & yard clean up of leftover construction material





### 3 / Edu-Skate

This is CJF's skateboard programming. Each weekday between 3pm -4.30pm free skateboarding classes are organised with a focus on a different life-skill each week. Registration is required for this programme.

**166** youths registered (between 6-16 years old)

- → Predominantly from local community
- → 49 girls (30%), 117 boys (70%)
- → Average age: 11

**11** classes given this month

→ Average class attendance: 9


#### Edu-Skate Registrations






## 4 / Homework programme


