Freedom Skatepark Programming

March 1st 2021 - March 31st 2021



Covid note: with the rising cases of Covid-19 in Jamaica, the Freedom Skatepark followed the government's new guidelines. This meant that from March the 1st no more than 10 people were allowed in the skatepark at any time (including staff). Because of rising challenges to maintain this maximum number of 10 people, the skatepark staff and committee made the decision to close the Freedom Skatepark to the public on March the 15th.

Consequently, the activities at the skatepark this month reduces significantly, as you will find in the following report.



1 / Get on Board

This is the boardloan programme the Skatepark has in place to facilitate people that would like to skate but don't have a skateboard. Anyone can access the programme for free if they help with small jobs around the skatepark or participate in Community Activities. Board and/or protection material can also be rented for \$100 JMD each. The rental money is 100% reinjected in the skatepark activities. Registration is required for this programme.





66 uses this month (March 2021)

- \rightarrow 50% was in exchange for money

2 / Community activities


Every month a community activity is organized to strengthen the community feeling for people engaged in the skatepark, as well as a 'trade-off' for free board rental. Besides the monthly Community Activity, little jobs can be done around the skatepark throughout the month in exchange for free board rental. The participants are a mix of Edu-Skate students, parents and local skateboarders.

Engagement in Community Activities in March 2021:

24 community jobs

Jobs included:

- → Mix cement for swing set installation
- \rightarrow Paint tire swings
- → Set up new boards
- \rightarrow Shovel gravel and dirt in preparation for new wall
- \rightarrow Move plants in preparation for the new wall



3 / Edu-Skate




171 youths registered (between 6-16 years old)

- → Average age: 11


