**Covid note:** with the rising cases of Covid-19 in Jamaica, the Freedom Skatepark followed the government's new guidelines. This meant that from March the 1st no more than 10 people were allowed in the skatepark at any time (including staff). Because of rising challenges to maintain this maximum number of 10 people, the skatepark staff and committee made the decision to close the Freedom Skatepark to the public on March the 15th.

For the entire month of April, the Freedom Skatepark was closed to the public.




# 1/Get on Board


This is the boardloan programme the Skatepark has in place to facilitate people that would like to skate but don't have a skateboard. Anyone can access the programme for free if they help with small jobs around the skatepark or participate in Community Activities. Board and/or protection material can also be rented for \$100 JMD each. The rental money is 100% reinjected in the skatepark activities. Registration is required for this programme.




#### **21** uses this month (April 2021)

# 2 / Community activities


Every month a community activity is organized to strengthen the community feeling for people engaged in the skatepark, as well as a 'trade-off' for free board rental. Besides the monthly Community Activity, little jobs can be done around the skatepark throughout the month in exchange for free board rental. The participants are a mix of Edu-Skate students, parents and local skateboarders.

# 3 / Edu-Skate

This is CJF's skateboard programming. Each weekday between 3pm -4.30pm free skateboarding classes are organised with a focus on a different life-skill each week. Registration is required for this programme.

- → 50 girls (28%), 126 boys (72%)
- → Average age: 11






# 4 / Homework programme
