Our hallmark program, the Edu-Skate program, designed by Concrete Jungle Foundation, teaches essential life skills through skateboarding, while our additional offerings, such as the homework programme, yoga, and conflict resolution classes, further empower our youth.

Over the past five years, we have witnessed incredible growth and transformation, positively impacting the youth in Bull Bay and beyond. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all our supporters whose unwavering commitment has made this journey possible.

As we look to the future, we are excited to expand our programmes, enhance our outreach, and continue making a lasting difference in the lives of the youth we serve. Thank you for being a part of our journey!

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Our Programmes

At Freedom Skatepark, we are dedicated to creating positive change in the community by empowering our youth through a variety of programs designed to foster skill development, teamwork, and personal growth. As we celebrate our 5-year anniversary, we are proud to share the impact numbers we've achieved over this time.



Homework Sessions

Our Homework Programme was initiated during the COVID-19 pandemic to support children in continuing their education while schools were closed. This essential program has flourished over the years, offering 244 homework sessions with a total attendance of 1,030, facilitated by our dedicated teachers providing after-school tutoring 3-4 days a week.

The programme covers critical topics, including Language Arts—spelling, reading and comprehension, and writing short compositions—as well as Social Studies and Math, all aligned with the school curriculum. This comprehensive support ensures that students receive personalized assistance tailored to their individual learning needs. By fostering a positive and engaging learning environment, our Homework Programme helps improve academic performance while building confidence and motivation among our youth.

We are proud of the positive impact this programme has made in the lives of our participants and remain dedicated to its continued growth and success.

Edu-Skate Classes

Our hallmark programme, the Edu-Skate Program, designed by Concrete Jungle Foundation, focuses on teaching essential life skills through skateboarding. To date, we have successfully delivered **364 Edu-Skate classes with an attendance of 3,191**, positively impacting their development both on and off the board.

The Edu-Skate programme covers key skills such as self-confidence, respect, resilience, perseverance, courage, cooperative learning, positivity, awareness, and creativity. We have engaged with children from our local community, as well as from St. Thomas, RISE, Supm Fi Talk Bout, and Denham Town High School, empowering our youth to build character while enjoying a fulfilling and active lifestyle.



Our Enrichment Activities programme has successfully executed **83 activities, with a total attendance of 341.** This initiative provides additional skills beyond traditional education, offering hands-on experiences that foster creativity and personal growth.

Our youth have engaged in a variety of activities including: surfing, arts and crafts, coding, shoe design, photography, yoga, music, carpentry, concrete work, skateboard art, t-shirt printing, auto mechanics, conflict resolution, and environmental science.

These programmes are designed to not only enhance the skills of our youth but also to inspire passion and curiosity in their personal and academic lives. By integrating these enrichment opportunities, we strive to provide a holistic approach to youth development that supports their overall well-being and prepares them for future success.

Community Activities



Our Community Activities programme plays a vital role in fostering a sense of ownership and pride within the local community. To date, we have successfully executed **1,410 community jobs** that demonstrate our commitment to enhancing our environment and the well-being of residents.

These activities include planting trees and flowers, watering plants, beautification projects, garden cleanup, painting, repairs, garbage collection, building a water fountain, and organizing both the library and community center. We have also involved community members in caring for and maintaining the green spaces to promote ongoing stewardship.


Through these initiatives, we empower residents to actively participate in the care and development of their surroundings, creating a collaborative and supportive community atmosphere that benefits everyone involved.

The Get-On-Board programme was established to provide individuals with an opportunity to experience skateboarding, regardless of their access to equipment. Understanding the barriers within our community, we offer the rental of skateboards for \$300 JMD, and protection gear for only \$100 JMD, based on the socio-economic status of participants.

For those unable to afford this nominal fee, we provide an alternative option to access the program in exchange for participation in community activities, promoting engagement and support.

To date, the Get-On-Board programme has had **9,802** rentals and generated **\$5,194 USD** in revenue, which is reinvested into the maintenance and improvement of the skatepark. This initiative not only empowers individuals to give skateboarding a try but also fosters community involvement and ensures the continued sustainability of our facility.

Moreover, we will introduce **Parenting Classes** to support families in nurturing their children's development and an **Entrepreneur Program** to help community members gain economic footing and achieve financial stability.

Together, these initiatives will further enrich our community and empower the youth we serve as we continue to foster a safe and supportive environment at the Freedom Skatepark. We are enthusiastic about the future and the opportunities it holds for growth and impact!



Remembering Andre 'Wildfiyah' Thompson - The Inspiration Behind Freedom Skatepark



As we mark five years of Freedom Skatepark, it's important to reflect on the remarkable story behind this community space. Many know that the park was dedicated in memory of Andre 'Wildfiyah' Thompson, a talented young Jamaican skateboarder, artist, and community advocate who tragically lost his life in 2009.

What might not be as widely known is that Andre was the true inspiration for establishing this skatepark. His passion for skateboarding, his dream of creating a space for Jamaica's youth, and his unwavering belief in the power of creative expression and social development fueled the vision that became Freedom Skatepark.

The project was born out of tragedy—Andre was murdered in 2009 at the age of 20. Just a few days before his death, Andre was featured in the mini-documentary JA SKATE, produced by LargeUp, which depicted the skateboarding scene in Jamaica at that time. You can watch the documentary here to see Andre and learn more about the skate culture he loved so much.

His hope for Jamaica to have a dedicated skatepark was shared in his final days. Today, his vision lives on through this space and the programs run here, transforming his dream into reality and embodying his spirit of resilience, creativity, and hope.

As we celebrate this milestone, we honor Andre's legacy—a reminder of how one young person's passion can inspire a movement and create lasting change.
